As we continue into the last half of May, please pray for the LWML MN South District as they prepare for their convention to be held on June 16-18 in Willmar. During the next couple of weeks all voting delegates will be voting on the proposed mission grant goal of \$270,000 as well as selecting which mission grant proposals will be funded for the 2022-2024 biennium. The results of the election will be announced at the convention. During the convention, delegates will vote on new officers and by-law revisions.
